Students must wear swimmers, a sunshirt, bucket hat, **sunscreen** and thongs. They will need to bring a towel, lunch and a waterbottle in their school bag. **Swimming things may be worn to school on this day.**

Students **must** bring their YSS uniform, underwear, shoes and socks to school in a **PLASTIC/swimming bag**. We will put our wet things in the bag when we return.

Please ensure all apparel and equipment are visibly named.

Transport: All students will be transported to Wetside Water Park by coach and in the company of class teachers.

Teachers will be in charge of any medication and will have first aid kits available and medical forms to ensure teachers are aware of any medical requirements.

To cover the cost of bus hire and for students to participate in this event, \$3.50 is payable to the office.

It is up to all parents/carers to decide what types and what level of private insurance they wish to arrange to cover their child. Please take this into consideration in deciding whether or not to allow your child to participate in this activity.
